Dr. Stein has a great deal of experience working as a psychiatrist with people experiencing Multiple Chemical Sensitivity (MCS) and made it clear that her experience contests the conclusion of the INSPQ report on MCS. According to Dr. Stein, MCS is not caused due to anxiety, but in fact chemicals have an important role in causation. We will be posting the recording from this amazing talk shortly. We are very grateful that Dr. Stein spoke at our event and we look forward to hosting more events like this one!

We are putting out the last call for people to participate in the committee to advise the association. This committee will be around 5-10 people with MCS who are interested in meeting once per month in this capacity. Meetings will be one hour long and will be accommodating if you need to miss a meeting due to health challenges.
